

# **Improvements**

## Villages

Village roads kept in character of the history, heritage, and eclectic nature of both Kingsland and Morningside; could include nods to various modes of transport used along the arterial route; horse and cart, tram and train with use of recycled materials; steel, metals - and the brick and wood used in the buildings predominently built in Edwardian and inter war periods, as well as the history of Eden Park, and NZ rugby.

## • Rail Plaza's

## 1A - Kingsland;

- a) Carry heritage theme through Kingsland rail plaza with wooden tabled seating to encourage community, outdoor dining, and staying in our neighbourhood.

#### Lamp posts;


- a) Black heritage look lamp posts connecting both village centres through to Eden Park
